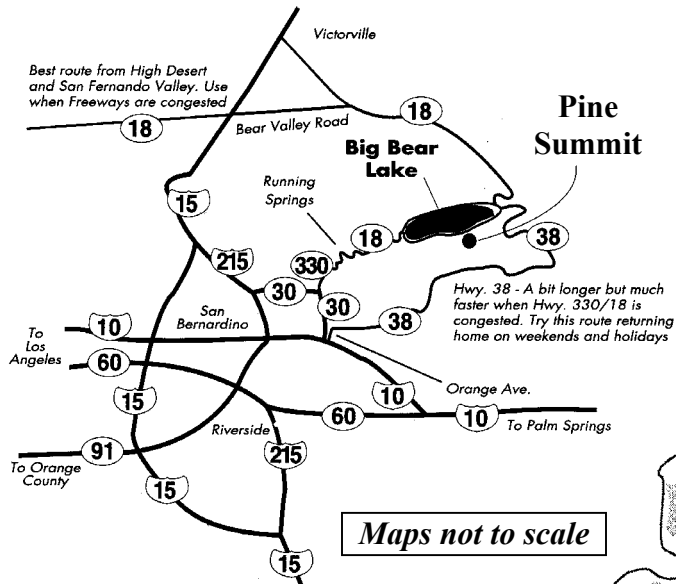
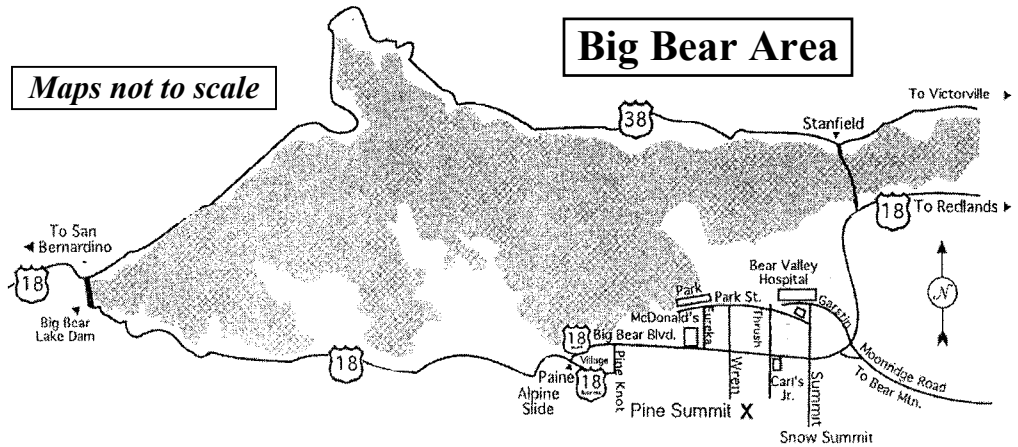


Directions to Pine Summit

The Front Way:

Take the I-10 or I-215 to SR 30 to SR 330 East. SR 330 turns into SR 18 in Running Springs. Follow SR 18 to Big Bear Lake and turn right to go over the dam. Follow SR 18 to the Village and turn left on Paine in order to stay on Big Bear Blvd. Take Big Bear Blvd. to Wren (the 1st street past McDonald's on the right) and turn right. Pine Summit is located at the end of this street. This route is mostly two lanes, but it has the most turnouts and passing lanes of the three routes to Big Bear. It is well-maintained in winter, but it is also the most heavily used route, making it the most congested on busy weekends and holidays.

The Scenic Way:

Take the I-10 to Redlands. Exit on Orange Street and go north. Turn right on Lugonia, which turns into SR 38. Follow SR 38 up the mountain and towards Big Bear City. Continue on SR 38 as it turns into SR 18 in Big Bear City. Follow SR 18 (Big Bear Blvd.) west into the city of Big Bear Lake. Drive past Summit Blvd. and turn left onto Wren (the 2nd street on the left past Carl's Jr.). Pine Summit is located at the end of this street. This route is longer in miles than the front way, but it has fewer sharp turns and is less congested during inclement weather and busy weekends. There are only a limited number of passing lanes, however.

The Back Way:

Take the I-395 or I-15 to Bear Valley Road. Head east on Bear Valley Road until it ends at SR 18. Take SR 18 east through Lucerne Valley. In Lucerne Valley, SR 18 "Y"s off to the right, leading towards the Big Bear Valley. Once in Big Bear, turn left at Stanfield Cutoff. Take this to Big Bear Blvd. and turn right. Turn left on Wren (the 2nd street on the left past Carl's Jr.). Pine Summit is located at the end of this street. This route climbs very quickly and has several hairpin turns. It offers the fewest miles of mountain driving, and is rarely congested.

Big Bear City Airport:

Big Bear Valley is served by a commercial airport that provides services to small aircraft. It is located 5 miles east of Big Bear Lake. Contact the airport for information on services available at (909) 585-3219.
