

The Packing List
a reminder of what to bring

Bedding

pillow
sheet and blankets or a sleeping bag

Clothing

sweater/sweatshirt, jacket
long pants (for worship & evenings)
sports clothing (shorts, t-shirts)
one piece swimsuit/swim trunks
*a dark t-shirt must be worn over a two-piece swimsuit
socks
sleepwear
tennis shoes
slippers (optional)
undergarments

Toiletries

towels
soap
shampoo
shaving articles
deodorant
toothpaste, toothbrush, cup
hair dryer/curling iron (optional)
hairspray, mousse, gel
comb or brush
lotion
lip balm

Other Things

BIBLE
notebook and pencil or pen
flashlight and batteries
kleenex
alarm clock
money (personal expenses)
camera (optional)

***DRESS POLICY:** All clothing must be within the bounds of decency and good taste. Clothing deemed to be distracting will not be allowed. This includes, but is not limited to:

- No bare midriffs, low-cut or revealing blouses or shirts. Garments shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments for both males and females.
- The length of dresses, skirts, and shorts shall be within the bounds of decency and good taste.

***CELL PHONE POLICY:** Cell phones may not be used during Camp. If you need to call home, you may use one of the Camp Directors' phones.

How to Pack

1. Do not bring anything that you do not really need.
2. All cameras or other items of value should be wrapped to prevent damage or carried with you personally.
3. Loose items such as blankets and sheets should be tied in a neat bundle.
4. All medication must be turned into the Camp Nurses at Orientation Monday morning. Medication will be dispensed by the Camp Nurses as prescribed. **If you need to carry your inhaler with you, please attach a note signed by your physician.**
5. Limit yourself to no more than two (2) pieces of luggage; a sleeping bag or bed roll counts as one (1) piece. Any additional items must be carried with you.
